Overall Impact

Created by The Joseph Fund during the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Summer Enrichment Program at the Child Development Center is a two-month, curriculum-based summer program that serves as a gateway for Pre-K and K students to begin their educational journeys.



Since 2021, over 100 students have been able to participate in our very own Summer Enrichment Program thanks to more than \$130,000 in support.

Over the last three years, we have provided tuition assistance to more than 150 Camden-based families.

We have contributed over \$200,000 in support to welcome 200+ Joseph Fund Scholars to receive a high-quality, values-based education. This year, six high school students at Camden Catholic and six students at Gloucester Catholic received individual support in excess of \$3,000 per student. We are proud to watch these young adults grow as Scholars and eventually become Joseph Fund Graduates.







Following a commitment from The Joseph Fund to support the Morales family throughout their educations, East Camden native Preston Brown served as a rallying force. As the Woodrow Wilson High School football coach, he is a beacon for the Camden community. Coach Brown brought to light some of the more somber conditions that affect the city. He instilled faith in his players that they could achieve, and soon after that, they were crowned Regional Champions. He was the subject of the NFL Film *Preston Brown: Improving Lives & the City of Camden Through Football.*

The Joseph Fund then awarded the Msgr. Robert T. McDermott Philanthropy and Community Service Award to the Dain Family. Just like The Joseph Fund itself is a family, Tony Dain has enriched our cause thanks to so many passionate members of their family supporting our mission. To further exemplify the Dains' altruism, their remarks ended with a declaration that **The Ralph L. & Florence A. Bernard Foundation would match an astounding \$30,000 raised tonight!**

With that, a thermometer appeared on screen and a fundraising blitz took place. In a matter of minutes, the thermometer was overflowing—\$90,000 was raised before dinner had even started! The Celebration raised over \$200,000 in scholarships to enable the next class of Joseph Fund Scholars to become medical professionals, regional champions, or proud parents themselves.
